Our first full week back has proven to be very productive for children and adults alike. The children have settled in to their daily routines and have worked hard to set themselves a high standard for the rest of the year.




We have been discussing unconditional love in our 'Family' topic over the last week. Children wrote poems titled 'Aspects of Love' to demonstrate the importance of love within our families.
