On Wednesday, Mr Stacey spoke to the children about developing a growth mindset. By developing a growth mindset, children start to consider intelligence as expandable (rather than static), embrace challenges (rather than avoid them) and persist in the face of setbacks (rather than give up). 'I can't do this' becomes 'I can't do this **yet**, but I will learn.' Developing a growth mindset helps our children to become more resilient and to always strive to achieve their Personal Best.




Our Wednesday Word for this week which links in with the Sunday Gospel is **TRUSTWORTHY**

Year 5




