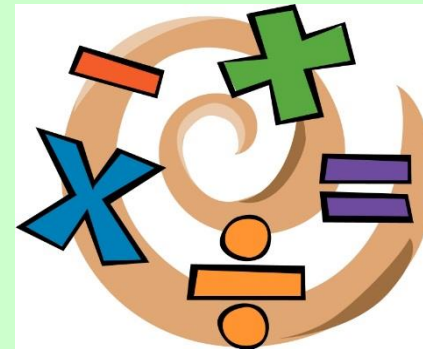
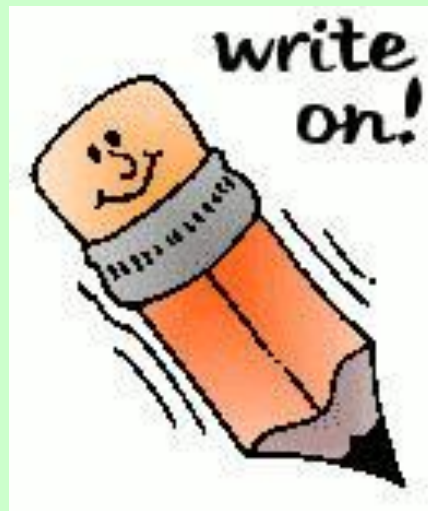
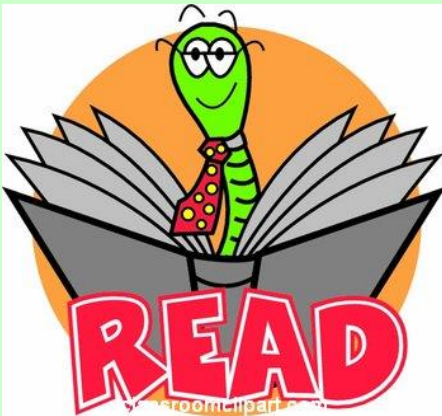
- We listen carefully to all members of staff and visitors.

- Particular focus on Reading, Writing, Grammar (English) and Mathematics and RE.



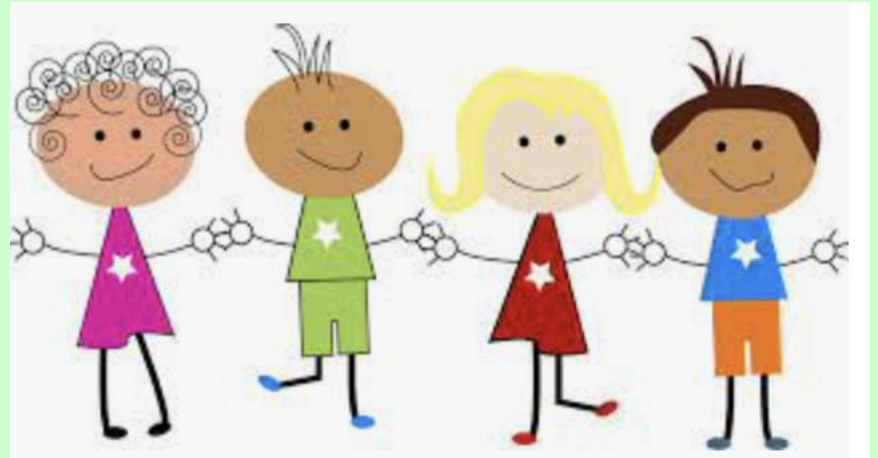

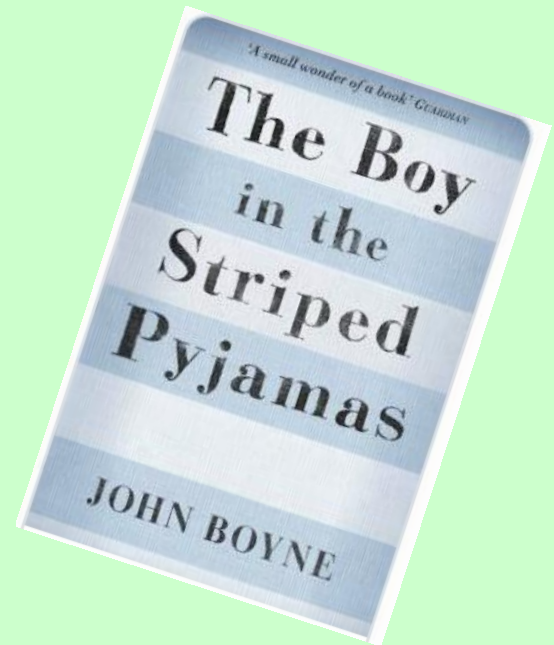

- Literacy: Revise and extend knowledge of all fiction and non fiction text types (narrative / poetry / recount / persuasion / journalistic / explanations etc).
- Editing - Focus on improving our writing.
- Focus on reading comprehension – reading for meaning.
- Grammar and spelling

Reading



- Encouraging your child to read daily for at least 20 minutes will be of great benefit to their reading ability.
- Being a fluent reader helps your child to access all areas of the curriculum.
- We have regular reading sessions in school, and a class novel which is focused on each half term.
- Children write reading reviews after completing a book.

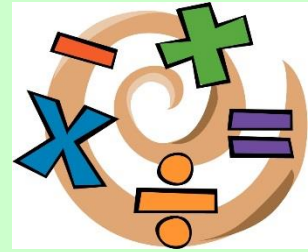


Writing



- This is a whole school focus.
- We encourage the children to leave St Joseph's being the best writers that they can be!
- Focus on use of powerful vocabulary (Wow words).
- Encouraging children to review and edit their work.
- Children must use correct punctuation (A, . ? ! " ")
- **Pen Licences**

Mathematics



- Focus on improving mental arithmetic skills.
- Developing confidence in the 4 basic operations (+ - x ÷). Over 50% of SATs questions are number based.
- Developing strategies for problem solving.
- Revising times table knowledge to at least x12.
- Other areas: Shape and Space / Measures

PE

- Twice a week - Alternate Tuesdays/Fridays and every Thursday.
- Lessons will be led by staff from Cardinal Vaughan School (class teacher supporting)
- Children to come to school in PE kits on these days.
- (black/white trainers)

Home Learning

Spellings – Google Classroom

Homework folders

- READING – every night for **at least 20 minutes**.
- It is crucial that homework is completed and brought in on time. (Record kept)
- Homework consolidates classroom learning.
- Encourages the children to take responsibility for their learning.
- Fosters good work habits for the future.
- (Secondary School routines)
- Daily homework and projects

SATs

- The children will take their SATs next May
- (w/b 9th May 2022).
- We will have a meeting in the Spring to discuss further.
- Children will take:
- Maths (arithmetic and reasoning)
- Reading (comprehension)
- SPAG – Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar
- We encourage the children to do their PB every day. That is what we ask for.

- Register your application on Pan London school applications site.
- Visit schools and get supplementary application forms.
- Read criteria **VERY** carefully.
- Complete supplementary application forms and submit to schools directly
- **ENSURE PAN LONDON APPLICATION IS SUBMITTED BY 31st OCTOBER 2021.**

School Choices

- 5 choices – fill them all in
- Only submit application if you meet **ALL** of the criteria.
- Private sector – liaise directly with schools
